How effective are targeted sanctions? Revisiting the Stockholm Process 10 years on

Friday 17 May, 09.30–12.00 at SIPRI, Signalistgatan 9, Solna

The UN Security Council has imposed targeted sanctions on arms flows, financial resources, travel and aviation connections, and specific export commodities for particular individuals, non-state actors and states—with varying success. The Stockholm Process was a Swedish initiative undertaken in 2001–2003 to strengthen the implementation and monitoring of so-called targeted sanctions. It was the last stage of a broad review of sanctions that also included the Interlaken and Bonn processes.

This seminar is an opportunity to examine the key developments and challenges to United Nations targeted sanctions that have emerged in the decade since the Stockholm Process findings were first presented to the Security Council. Speakers will give their assessments of the influence of the Stockholm Process on current sanctions regimes and the implementation and monitoring of targeted sanctions today.
