SIPRI Director Dan Smith in conversation with Major General Mitch Mitchell

After two decades of growing peace following the end of the cold war in 1991, recent years have seen an increase in armed conflict. Crisis and war in the Middle East, a surge of refugees, growing signs of the destabilizing impact of climate change, escalating rivalries between the great powers—all this generates risks that challenge the achievements of peacebuilding, and the prospect of future success.

The British Development, Concepts and Doctrine Centre (DCDC) offers 'a clearer long-term, truly joint, vision of the way in which we expect our forces to operate'. In the midst of the upheaval that events in 2016 have brought, looking ahead, what are the big issues that generate sources of insecurity? Is there a new cold war?
